OUR PROJECT

Our project entitled “Promoting Resilient and Organized Citizenry towards Empowerment and Community Transformation for Peace in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao”, also known as PROTECT Peace in the BARMM is a three-year project agreement between the Consortium of Bangsamoro Civil Society, Inc. (CBCS) and the Global Community Engagement and Resilience Fund (GCERF) that aims to build people’s capacity for peacebuilding and socio-economic development in the BARMM.

The project focusing on two (2) main components such as Good Governance and Livelihood and will be covering 40 communities in the municipalities of Omar of Sulu, Panglima Sugala and Bonggao in Tawi-tawi, Lamitan City in Basilan, Matanog in Maguindanao del Norte and Carmen and Pikit in North Cotabato BARMM-SGA area.

MARKING THE OFFICIAL KICK-OFF FOR THE PHASE 2 OF PROTECT PEACE IN THE BARMM PROJECT; CBCS SUCCESSFULLY HELD PROJECT ORIENTATION AND LAUNCHING PROGRAM

Promoting Resilient and Organized Citizenry towards Empowerment and Community Transformation for Peace in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao, also dubbed as PROTECT Peace in the BARMM project has commenced its official kick-off last March 7-10, 2023 at The Loft Hotel, Iligan City. The said project is a continuation of the recently concluded three-year agreement between the Global Community Engagement and Resilience Fund (GCERF), the funding partner, and the Consortium of Bangsamoro Civil Society (CBCS), Inc. as the primary recipient of the project.

Present to the said program were the sub-recipient (SR) partners of the CBCS namely Kadtabanga Foundation for Peace & Development Advocates (KFPDAI), Inc. in the Province of Maguindanao; Integrated Mindanaon Association for Natives (IMAN), Inc. of North Cotabato and Special Geographic Areas; Tarbilang Foundation Inc. (TFI) of Tawi-Tawi; Gagandilan Mindanao Women, Inc. (GMWI) of Sulu; and Lamitan City Rosewomen Organization Inc. (LCRWOI) of Basilan; who signified their acceptance to the partnership through the ceremonial signing of the memorandum of agreement.

Further, the official symbol for the PROTECT Peace Phase 2 of the project was solemnized by a symbolic launching which was graced by the presence of the GCERF management all the way from Geneva, Switzerland, headed by its Country Manager Basile Ema Ebede, with National Advisor for the Philippines Atty. Jennifer Buan, P&I Specialist Rana Elmeligy, P&I Associate Samhita Ayaluri, and PMU Associate Isabela Ottoni, also have provided inputs on the formulation of another set of results framework and work and financial plans to the aforementioned partners.

CBCS Chairperson Guiamel Alim also presented inputs about community engagement and project management, while Admin Officer Danilo Mocsin directed the SRs with some points about basic due diligence requirements and gave a snapshot of the total budget per SR for another three-year duration.

The three-day activity was concluded with a workshop for the SRs pertaining to Project Concept Presentation and Reporting System by Project Officer Alimudin Mala.

CBCS - GCERF - GMWI PROTECT PEACE TEAM TOGETHER WITH DILG CONDUCTED A SUSTAINING RESILIENT COMMUNITIES LEARNING VISIT AND DIALOGUE WITH PARTNERS IN SULU

Project staffs under the Promoting Resilient and Organized Citizenry towards Empowerment and Community Transformation for Peace in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) or PROTECT Peace in the BARMM Project, a project agreement between the Consortium of Bangsamoro Civil Society (CBCS), Inc. the Global Community Engagement and Resilience Fund (GCERF), and Gagandilan Mindanao Women Inc. CBCS-GCERF COMMENCED BASELINE SURVEY AND INDUSTRY MAPPING FOR PROTECT PEACE IN THE BARMM – PHASE 2

A three-year project agreement between the Consortium of Bangsamoro Civil Society (CBCS), Inc. and the Global Community Engagement and Resilience Fund (GCERF) entitled Promoting Resilient and Organized Citizenry towards Empowerment and Community Transformation for Peace in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (PROTECT Peace in the BARMM), inaugurated the project through simultaneous commencement of the Baseline Survey and Industry Mapping last May 15-30, 2023 to forty (40) Barangays in BARMM.

The successful conduct of the activity was a joint effort of the five (5) subrecipient partners in the respective Provinces namely Kadtabanga Foundation for Peace and Development Advocacy, Inc. (KFPDAI) in Maguindanao del Norte, Integrated Mindanaoan Association of Natives (IMAN), Inc. in North Cotabato-Special Geographic Area, Lamitan City Rosewomen Organization, Inc. (LCRWOI) in Basilan, Gagandilan Mindanao Women, Inc. (GMWI) in Sulu, and Tarbilang Foundation, Inc. (TFI) in Tawi-Tawi.

The survey-mapping which served as the first community-based intervention for the project aims to gather accurate understanding to the situations of target communities in terms of governance and socio-economic status which will be the foundation for an informed

decision-making and intervention planning. The well-detailed data then can be used to design appropriate interventions to address the most pressing needs while also supporting sustainable economic growth in the region.

The overall result of the survey will be presented to the Local Government Units (LGU's) and the concerned Provincial Ministries to complement to their available programs and gain collaboration towards effective and efficient delivery of the basic services to the people in the communities.

CBCS-GCERF'S PROTECT PEACE PROJECT TEAM UNDERTAKES PSYCHOSOCIAL TRAINING BY DILG PCVE-PMO

Twenty (20) staffs under the Promoting Resilient and Organized Citizenry towards Empowerment and Community Transformation for Peace in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM) or PROTECT Peace in the BARMM Project, a project agreement between the Consortium of Bangsamoro Civil Society (CBCS), Inc. and the Global Community Engagement and Resilience Fund (GCERF) were able to undertake a two-day psychosocial training conducted by the Department of Interior Local Governance (DILG) under the Preventing and Countering Violent Extremism Program Management Office (PCVE-PMO), last June 15-16, 2023 at L' Meridian Suites, Zamboanga City.

With the objectives of equipping the local implementers with the necessary knowledge, skills and approaches to effectively address the psychosocial needs of the clients and communities affected by armed conflict, the participants underwent series of lectures and workshops on Understanding the Foundation of One's Self, Coping Mechanisms and Self-care.

"We are the vessel of change so let us not forget to take care of



ourselves and remember that selfcare is important" – Dr. Jowima Ang-Reyes, RSW, Associate Professor V from the College of Social Work and Community Development of the University of the Philippines - Diliman, the invited Resource Speaker reminded the participants after all the sharing and sessions.

Halima Alfonso, one of the participants expressed her gratitude to the DILG and GCERF for organizing such training. "We couldn't thank you enough for providing us this training. We, frontliners truly need more sessions like this and we hope that this would not be the last." – said Alfonso as she acknowledged the efforts of the organizers.

The psychosocial training is one of the Civil Society Organization (CSO) Collaboration Activity of the DILG PCVE-PMO in partnership with GCERF on its commitment to strengthen the effective implementation of the National Action Plan (NAP) on PCVE, NAP Community-Based Restoration and Reconciliation (CBRR), and National Task Force on the Disbandment of Private Armed Groups (NTF-DPAGs).

IMAN INC. CONDUCTS BASELINE SURVEY AND INDUSTRY MAPPING IN SGA, BARMM PROJECT AREAS

IMAN Inc., in collaboration with the Consortium of Bangsamoro Civil Society (CBCS), recently conducted a comprehensive Baseline Survey and Industry Mapping in several target communities within the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM). The activity took place on May 17, 2023, in Nalapaan, Pikit, and Manarapan, Carmen, followed by Kitulaan and Nasapian, Carmen, on May 18, 2023.

The Baseline Survey and Industry Mapping serve as critical tools for gaining a comprehensive understanding of the governance and socio-economic status of these communities. By collecting and analyzing data on various socio-economic indicators and identifying existing industries and sectors, valuable insights into the communities' needs, strengths, weaknesses, and potential opportunities can be obtained.

The participants in these activities included representatives from the Barangay Local Government Units (BLGU), religious and tribal leaders, farmers, fishers, women-led organizations, youth-led organizations, health organizations, academic institutions, and the Lupon. This diverse group of stakeholders ensured a holistic perspective and a comprehensive assessment of the community's situation.

SRs' Activities

The initiative is part of The PROTECT PEACE IN BARMM PROJECT, which aims to promote resilient and organized citizenry towards empowerment and community transformation for peace in the region. The project, officially launched in January 2023, is scheduled for completion in December 2025, spanning three years. It receives funding support from the Global Community Engagement and Resilient Funds (GCERF).

IMAN Inc., as one of the five sub-recipients supervised by CBCS, is responsible for implementing the project in 8 barangays in SGA, BARMM. The other sub-recipients include Kadtabanga Foundation for Peace & Development Advocates (KFPDAI) in Maguindanao, Tarbilang Foundation Inc. (TFI) in Tawi-Tawi, Gagandilan Mindanao Women, Inc. (GMWI) in Sulu, and Lamitan City Rosewomen Organization Inc. (LCRWOI) in Basilan. Together, they will cover a total of 40 barangays in the region.

The Baseline Survey and Industry Mapping conducted by IMAN Inc. and CBCS are expected to provide valuable insights that will guide the design of appropriate interventions to address the most pressing needs of the target communities. Moreover, these tools will support sustainable economic growth and contribute to the overall development of the region.

LCRWOI COMMENCED THE BASELINE SURVEY AND INDUSTRY MAPPING IN LAMITAN CITY

On April 13, 2023, at the conference room of the Mayor, the Lamitan City ROSE Women Organization Inc started its second quarter activity with the joined coordination meeting with the CBCS PROTECT Peace Project Team Project Officer Mr. Alimuddin Mala, Ms. Samra Lambitan and Ms. Halima Alfonso together with the City Government of Lamitan headed by the Mayor Hon. RODERICK FURIGAY and with the different agencies like the Philippine Coconut Authority (PCA) represented by the Agriculturists Ms. Onesima Hayawan and Mr. Muslimin Abdurahman, Office of the City Agriculturist, MTIT and DTI, CSWDO, MILG, CDRRM, and the City Planning Office. The project orientation was presented by Mr. Ali Mala. The CLGU and other agencies presented also their concerns and committed support to the project. At the same time, the Honorable Mayor approved the proposed target for eight barangays to wit: Tumakid, Tandung Ahas, Buahhan, Balas, Maloong San Jose, Bohe yawas, Baas, and Parangbasak.

The CBCS Project Team and LCRWOI Team had a coordination meeting with MAFAR PD Hanie Junuban and SCARBIDCI representatives on livelihood programs and coffee production in the cooperatives. Mr Hanie Junuban expressed his gratitude to the Team to be able to coordinate and connect farmers and other

sectors to the Ministry to avail the programs and projects available for livelihood sustainability.

After their visit, the LCRWOI team had a courtesy call to the BLGUs to conduct the Baseline Survey and Industry Mapping.

The team commenced the Baseline Survey and Industry Mapping on May 22–26 2023 covering all 8 targeted barangays in Lamitan City with the supervision of the CBCS Team.

Afterward, the team took an assessment and evaluation of the activities.

FARMERS' PROFILING NCFRS AND RSBSA GEO-TAGGING

The Lamitan City ROSE Women Organization, Inc. conducted the Farmers' Orientation in the month of May 2023 to the eight (8) target barangays and we found out that many farmers had filed for registration last year 2021 and 2022 but there was no result of approval. The Team decided to coordinate again with the Office of PCA and learned that most applications were rejected or disapproved due to a lack of attachments and data inconsistency. Then the Team decided to invite the PCA Team and MAFAR to the next activity on the Farmers' Profiling, registration, and validation of applications in the month of June. In this activity, the ROSE Team requested the PCA Team to bring along the previous applications of the farmers so they know the exact reason for disapproval and can comply with the requirements that are lacking for the attachments.

In the month of June 2023, the ROSE Team conducted the Farmers' Profiling, registration, and validation in four (4) barangays like Tumakid, Tandung Ahas, Parangbasak, and Bohe Yawas. The PCA Team had validated 132 NCFRS applications of farmers and many more applications complying with the requirements. The RSBSA of MAFAR has many applications for Geo-tagging because the MAFAR Agriculturist Office will conduct training for Geo-tagging for

volunteers from the barangays. This is a continuing activity of registration for the Months of July and August for the other four target barangays: Buahan, Balas, Maloong San Jose, and Baas. The registrations, validation, and retrieval of forms are going on to reach our target farmers and fisherfolks until the end of August 2023 in accordance with our work plan.

As the protect peace project started the implementation for its second phase, the Tarbilang foundation GCERF Team has started social preparations. The activities included visits to the different ministries like MOST, MTIT, TESDA-MBHTE and MAFAR.

During the meeting with the MAFAR Provincial Director dated May 26, 2023, the TFI project officer was able to share a short briefing on the protect peace project. During this meeting, the PD decided to schedule an awarding ceremony for the turn-over of hog wires and seedlings from MAFAR on the 29th of May, 2023.

There was also a formal meeting after the turn over, allowing the team to present the project in detail in the presence of the Municipal MAFAR officers assigned in Bongao and Panglima Sugala, the projects' target areas.

The meeting productively ended with the Ministry's commitment to assist the best way they can.

There was also a similar commitment coming from other ministries, with support in terms of technical knowhow and capacity building.

They were also keen in encouraging the associations or cooperatives of the beneficiaries be profiled and registered for them to be prioritized of the projects and programs they offer.

Aside from the visits to the ministries, the team also conducted baseline survey which focused on the Barangay profiling and key informant interviews, looking into the issues, concerns and needs of the target areas. The team was able to gather the necessary data for the incoming implementation of the project. .

For other activities, the TFI staff were also able to attend audits ad meetings initiated by the Provincial Government and DILG in partnership with PDEA and the PNP. Activities, such as the Peace and Order council which showed the Municipalities' initiatives on peace and security allowed the team to see how the Province advocates for peace showing a link to the protect peace project goals.

KFPDAI TEAM CONDUCTED THE BASELINE SURVEY AND INDUSTRY MAPPING IN MATANOG, MAGUINDANAO

With the supervision of the CBCS-PROTECT Peace Team, the Kadtabanga Foundation for Peace and Development Advocates, Inc. (KFPDAI) commenced the Baseline Survey and Industry Mapping in eight targeted barangays in Matanog, Maguindanao, on May 25–30, 2023. The activity took place in Bugasan Sur, Bugasan Norte, Bayanga Norte, Bayanga Sur, Langkong, Central Langkong, Sapad, and Kidama in the Municipality of Matanog, Province of Maguindanao del Sur.

The survey mapping aims to gather accurate information about the governance and socioeconomic status of the community, which serves as the foundation for an effective intervention plan for the community.

The activity was attended by the different sectors of the BLGU, including the Lupon, Religious Leaders, Ips, representatives of women and youth, and farmers.

The KFPDAI is one of the sub-recipients of the PROTECT-Peace in the BARMM Project based in the Province of Maguindanao Del Norte and is responsible for project implementation in the

selected eight barangays in the Municipality of Matanog.

The results of the baseline survey and industry mapping will be presented to the Local Government Unit (LGU) Matanog and Provincial Ministries of the BARMM in order to supplement their current programs and gain collaboration in providing the community with essential services.
